SPEAK UP NOW FOR BETTER PUBLIC TRANSPORT AT PUBLIC FORUM, SAY MAYORS

24 January 2013

Councils are calling for residents and businesses of the Northern Beaches and Mosman to stand up and voice their support for better public transport at a public forum being held on the planned Bus Rapid Transit system (BRT).

The Northern Beaches Bus Rapid Transit Forum will be held in Dee Why on 30 January 2013. It will be hosted by local MPs The Hon. Mike Baird MP and The Hon. Brad Hazzard MP and will feature presentations from Transport for NSW, Infrastructure NSW and SHOROC on options and proposals for this region.

The community is invited to attend to find out more and have their say on the transport options and solutions for our area.

“Traffic and transport have for many years been the number one issue for our residents and business and we have been working long and hard to get the problems fixed,” said SHOROC President and Warringah Mayor Michael Regan.

Encouragingly the NSW Government has identified a BRT is feasible for the region, has included a Northern Beaches BRT in the NSW Long Term Transport Master Plan and Infrastructure NSW included a ‘Northern Beaches Link’ in its State Infrastructure Strategy.

“These are encouraging signs, but we need commitment to short term action. Our region’s transport woes remain a major issue and we’ll all be reminded just how bad it is when traffic congestion returns to its peak when school resumes next week.”

“SHOROC has put together a practical package of measures for the coming years to fix the transport system based on the options identified by the NSW Government, together with a plan of action to get things moving,” said Mayor Regan.

“Let’s get on with the job of fixing it.”

“We strongly encourage the community to attend this forum to have their say and support the campaign better public transport and targeted road upgrades for our region,” said Mayor Regan.
